## Drummoyne Reds eclipse the Stars

THE Drummoyne Vintage Reds took on the Mosman All Stars in the annual Veterans' Day Golden Oldies soccer match at Drummoyne Oval on Saturday.

The Reds retained the Aftom Hema Trophy for another year.

The team was led by Captain Doctor David Todd and special mention should go to Anthony Swanson, who showed plenty of pace on the wing.

A second half try to centre Ross Pollet sealed the 10-0 win.

Drummoyne Firsts scored two quick long range tries to centre Pule Mesa, who showed great soccer skills to toe the ball three times before diving on it to score his second. Mosman responded with a couple of tries themselves, keeping the half time score to 19-17.

An early second half scuffle between the teams left Drummoyne without two players and Mosman without one.

Drummoyne continued to split the defence at will, with centre Inoke Turuva breaking through three tackles to score the decisive try, setting up a 45-22 win for Drummoyne.

Drummoyne Seconds scored a bonus point for scoring four tries before the half-time break with winger Dan Hall and hooker Alex Cruikshank scoring. A penalty try to Mosman before the half-time break briefly let them back into the game but further tries to fullback Peter Whan closed out an entertaining 45-34 victory for Drummoyne.

In other matches, Drummoyne Thirds lost 10-9 from penalty on the final whistle.

Fourth grade lost 6-5, fifth grade lost 12-10 and Colts lost 22-0.

This weekend Drummoyne travel to Barra Brui Oval, St Ives to take on Knox Old Boys, who sit second on the club championship ladder behind Drummoyne.
