Drummoyne vs. Campbelltown at Drummoyne Oval 9th May 2009


Drummoyne **firsts** started strongly, with a try to lock Will Fitzpatrick and two tries to NSW Suburban Representative Josh Maleko to take a 17-10 lead at half time. The second half was marred by injuries and yellow cards but two tries to fullback Dwight Shepherd, the last in which he injured his shoulder, gave the home team a 31-24 win to move the team to the top of the Kentwell Cup ladder. Special mention should go to NSW suburban representative number eight Trent Tapps who worked tirelessly around the pitch and dominated the lineouts.

Second Grade conceded an early try to Campbelltown before posting two of their own to winger Martin Tevaga to take a slim 14-13 lead at half time. Led by the new centre pairing of Scott Worgan and Tani Isaia, Drummoyne ran in two more tries to flanker Richard Jobson and centre Worgan to get a bonus point 31-15 win.

Third grade played out a 5 all draw, with number eight Gareth Kelly scoring the only try for Drummoyne.

Fourth Grade dominated territory and possession in the first half, but two tries against the run of play gave Campbelltown a 14-3 half time lead. A converted try by fly-half Damien McCaulay kept the team in the hunt, but eventually lost the game 29-10.

Fifth grade lost 49-7, while **Colts** led 17-0 at half time before falling away and losing 24-17 to pick up a bonus point.
