DDRFC - LIFE MEMBERS

1. H (Harry) GROSE * Appointed 1933

Captain Balmain DRFC 1911-13, Fullback and centre. Secretary Balmain DRFC 1914-1919. Instrumental, with Dr H Moran in merging the Glebe and Balmain Clubs in 1919. Appointed Life Member of NSWRU in 1940. President DDRFC 1940-1951. Patron 1953-1975.

2. E (Ted) MULLETT * Appointed 1933

Captain Balmain DRFC 1903-1908. Loose forward. First Rugby player in Australia to play 100 first grade games. President Drummoyne Juniors 1933-1950. Appointed Life Member of the NSWRU 1940. Patron DDRFC 1938-1951

3. SJ (Syd) GROSE * Appointed 1938

The earliest photo we have of Syd is in a match played by a Drummoyne touring team against Duntroon Military College in Canberra, dated 1922. The last is one taken with Syd, in full Vintage Reds gear, kicking off in the 1983 Golden Oldies aged 83. All those intervening years he was a committed Red. First grade player, first grade referee, selector, coach, NSWRU delegate. You name it, Syd did it.

4. CE MORGAN * Appointed 1939

First grade player mid 1920's. Went on to become an International referee. 4 Tests from 1932-1934. President of DDRFC 1929 - 1937. An outstanding administrator. Was Town Clerk of Drummoyne City Council for forty years.

5. Dr RL (Pup) RAYMOND (OBE) * Appointed 1957

Product of Fivedock Juniors, became an outstanding Waratah and Wallaby winger playing 13 Tests 1920 to 1923, scoring 10 tries. Rhodes scholar to Oxford 1924. Chosen to play for England, 3 Tests. Came back to play 55 first grade matches for the Club. Club Coach 1948-1951. Club President in 1952. Patron 1953-1963.

6. AJ (Arnold) TANCRED * Appointed 1957

Strong back rower in the Club's Premiership team of 1925, became a Waratah and Wallaby in 1927-1928. Highly respected in the administration of the NSWRU. Was the Manager of the very successful 1947- 1948 Wallabies to the UK, France and USA.

Largely responsible for the formation of the Licensed Club. Life Member of the NSWRU in 1950

7. E (Ted) CORAM Appointed 1957

The loss of an eye curtailed Ted's playing career, which began in several outstanding DDRFC junior premiership teams of the Thirties. Became the Hon Secretary during WW11, a difficult time when players, officials and referees were in short supply. For 10 years he was the Club delegate to the NSWRU, member of the important Schools' Committee of the NSWRU. Referee, and for many years the Club's touch judge. His other posts were Social Secretary and Selector. Maintains a strong interest in the Club and in the players, particularly the Drummoyne Juniors.

8. Dr L (Les) HIATT * Appointed 1961

The Club's long serving medical officer 1946-1959. Many of his stitches are still in place.

9. SG (Sep) LANGDON * Appointed 1972

Began his long career with the Club as the first grade team manager, then became our outstanding Secretary 1950 – 58. He was a highly popular Club President from 1963-67, always there with calm counsel and a personal interest in the well being of all players in every team. See later notes on the great partnership he formed with his wife Betty, now also a Life Member.

10. W G (Grahame) FIRTH Appointed 1978

Became involved with the Club for the very best of reasons his sons Bernard and David and son-in-law David Dyer were all keen players. A superb organizer, he was a splendid Club Secretary from 1961-1970 and then President 1971-2. He was a well respected member of the Committee of the Sydney Rugby Union.

11. VA ("Bunky") AULAND * Appointed 1978

One of Drummoyne's great players, member of the 1936 First Grade Premiership team of 1936, a rugged, uncompromising tight head breakaway, he was to chosen to play for NSW against the All Blacks and from all accounts, gave them plenty. Club President 1968-1970, then again 1973-1975. He was our Patron 1976 – 1994. His great loves were running the weekly raffle and organizing the car park.

12. A (Alan) CRAWFORD D.F.C.* Appointed 1986.

A player in the strong 1930's era, Alan was on outstanding RAAF bomber pilot during WW11, completing 55 bombing missions over Germany, mentioned in despatches 3 times for getting his burning plane home and being awarded the DFC. Returned home in 1945 to work hard for his old club over many years in many capacities as selector, Coach and Secretary in 1971, 1983 and 1984. Every Monday night for the seasons 1947-1985 he attended as our delegate the meetings of the NSWRU Grades Committee.

13. JG (John) MULFORD Appointed 1989

Captain of the Red's State junior undefeated Premiership teams of 1947-1978 and the Combined State U21 team, played in the First Grade team 1949-52 and then became a first grade referee. President of the Club 1982-87. Elected President of the Sydney Rugby Union in 1989 and Chairman and Senior Vice President of the NSWRU in 1990. Club Patron 2001 to present.

14. D (David) DYER * Appointed 1992

A fine player for Drummoyne Juniors and then in the senior grades, David extended his playing career after retirement in the Fifties by being available at call whenever a player went missing , no matter which team. He would then back up by running the line for first grade. What a clubman! With his financial expertise and wise counsel, he was an outstanding Club Treasurer from 1982 to 1991. Together with his wife Robin, now a Vice President of the Club, he kept the Club afloat through tough times.

15. M (Max) MILES * Appointed 1994

Fine first grade centre, Captain / Coach and lock forward in the Fifties, he was the backbone of the Club's on field efforts and was very unlucky not to have been selected for higher honours. He was the Club's Honorary Solicitor for many years and gave distinguished service in that role also to the NSWRU and the Australian Rugby Union. A true Rugby man.

16. AT (Arthur) TIERNEY * Appointed 1996

Our first grade hooker and front rower of the early forties, Arthur became one of Australia's most respected and loved characters. He refereed 140 first grade games and topped his career with the whistle by being appointed to referee the Test between Australia and the British Lions in 1959. Following his retirement, he became the Club's long serving timekeeper. He overcame a speech impediment with some classical oneliners which are still quoted by Wallabies and Reds around Australia.

17. R (Bob) DAY Appointed 2002

Long-time mate of Arthur Tierney, uncompromising eighty minute player from the forties and Assistant Commissioner of NSW Police, Bob dedicated many years to his old Club as Secretary, from 1989 to 1996, as a selector and delegate. He fought hard for the Club's return to First Division. A great swimmer in the World's Master Games, Bob encouraged the game of Rugby within the Police Force and tours both outbound and inbound around the world.

18. E (Betty) LANGDON Appointed 2002

Who could ever forget those 26 years Betty and her ladies ran just the best Rugby Kiosk in Sydney, initially with quite primitive facilities. Betty's cups of tea revived many a flagging player, as did her spirited words of encouragement. A great collaborator with husband Sep, as Secretary and then President, their home was the heart of Drummoyne Rugby for nearly 3 decades.

19. R (Roy) STEPHENSON Appointed 2002

A great Club stalwart, whose 3 sons, Barry, David and Michael have themselves given great service to the Club; he spent his young days growing up in Cometrowe Street, adjacent to the Oval. Always a strong debater on issues vital to the Club. Perhaps Roy's most notable contribution was the organizing of that superb Testimonial for the Club's great Australian Captain, Greg Davis, whose death at a relatively young age left a young family in need of support. Roy mobilized the support of the whole Australian Rugby community and raised a large sum for a Foundation which provided for Greg's young family and educated the children.

20. F (Fred) ANDREWS Appointed 2004

Fred's playing days concluded in 1980. In 1982 he became involved in the Management Committee when John Mulford became President. In 1983 he took over Colts, coaching in what became known as the Golden Age of Drummoyne Colts. Fred moved up to the senior grades in 1987 and took over 1st Grade in 1989. His team won ten of their last 11 matches including a memorable victory over Minor Premiers, Norths. Fred then formed a close coaching alliance with former First Grade and Club Captain Peter McSullea, which took the club into the nineties and eventually back into First Division.

In more recent years, Fred has been the cornerstone of the re-birth of the club in the NSWSRU as both as a Grade Coach and Club Coach.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

YEAR 2005 – Season 131

It was a given certainty that our outstanding 2005 would be a hard season to follow and it was.

The run on line up for the first round of the season saw only 3 players from last year's Kentwell Cup winning side take the field. The ripple effect down through the grades was visible in all bar 5th Grade, which benefited from the consolidation of last year's 5th and 6th grades, essentially "F Troop" into one grade. However, where most clubs may have struggled with the challenge, we remained in contention throughout. In the end both 2^{nd} and 5th Grades gained Grand Final experience, an investment which should pay dividends next season.

Colts, in spite of some very one-sided results, never gave up or lost the respect of their opponents, to the point that a number of opposition coaches took time out to write and complement them on their "never say die" attitude. Their average age is still low for under 21 competition, but it's encouraging that two of the squad were in the 2nd Grade Grand Final side. Next season!

Ladies had a mixed season, like the Grades, a rebuilding year with a number of first time players making up the numbers, but they finished in positive mode and should reap the benefits next season.

Juniors continue in strength of numbers and a good standard under the strong leadership of Michael Stephenson and Michael Hahn.

The on field season was tough, with our depth of 2005 diminished, but the turn out at the Grand Final and the attendance on Presentation Day are proof positive that the spirit is as strong as ever. Vice Presidents' and Veteran's Day, in spite of the wet weather postponement still drew large numbers and most grades rose to the occasion and made it a winning day

Financially we recovered from the deficit inherited from 2005 and will end this season with money in the bank. Again, Geoff Granger has to be recognized for his dedication to keeping us solvent and likewise all our sponsors, without whom we could not survive.

Thanks also to John Mulford our Club Patron for his continued support and wise counsel; the support of all of the Management Committee, driven by Geoff (Mungo) Porter, Club Secretary; Sandy Bannatyne, Home Ground Steward and his fantastic group of helpers in the Canteen(s) led by Elma, Sheila, Toni, Lee, Jane, Ronnie and Tony ("Beep-Beep") on the BBQ who all contribute to making our home ground an environment second to none.

Coaching again was led by Fred Andrews. In a "rebuilding" year, coaching and managing becomes that much more of a challenge. Credit and thanks are due to all those identified in the various team reports for their commitment and dedication. They are all volunteers and it would be hard to find a better team, or team leader.

Thanks also to Dr David Todd, Dr Ronald Chin, Tim Cruikshank and his team of physios, Shane Kelly for strapping, and the Scoring box team.

As always, I acknowledge the support of my wife Elma and her passionate support through the tough times as well as the good times.

Next season will see some minor changes. Mungo Porter will retire as Club Secretary at this year's AGM. His contribution over the last few years has been enormous and is sincerely acknowledged. We also anticipate some changes in the coaching line up with Darren Lawrence and Ross Edwards taking a rest. Both have made enormous contributions both as players and coaches over the years.

It is the commitment of all involved that differentiates us from the rest. We have seen other clubs come and go from the NSWSRU Kentwell competition and so far none have returned. Our close neighbors, Dundas Valley withdrew from the competition in mid-season mainly due to a lack of player depth, but the root cause is almost certainly linked to their off-field depth. Its an object lesson that we cannot ignore as we continue to protect our amateur legacy and professional delivery. This can only be sustained through the passion for the club of players, past players, administrators and supporters alike. Its what makes us who we are.

In conclusion, close season activity and planning is well advanced for season 132 and I firmly believe that we can look forward with confidence, but not complacency, to being the club to beat again in 2006.

2ND GRADE REPORT

Many of the great modern-day coaches (Neil ET McDonald, Anthony "Swanno" Swanson & Andrew "Simmo" Simpson) often use the old cliché "it was a game of two halves" when describing the performance of their teams, however I think with 2nd Grade in season 2005, we can create our own and say "It was a season of two halves".

After winning the title the previous year, history tells us that with retirements, changes to personnel and other clubs lifting whenever they take on the defending premiers, it is always going to be difficult to match that same performance again the following year. At this moment in time it would be great for me to sit back and tell everyone that the coaching team created a miracle and turned this team around to lose only 9 of its last 11 games and get to the Grand Final. Yes the record will show that, but there were many reasons why this happened and there were also many reasons we may never know how it actually happened.

Firstly, we started to get some stability to our team. The club began having some change of luck with injuries, due to the form of our first grade team there were less changes and disruption which meant the boys could get some combinations going and more importantly all the boys began playing with some pride. Then there was the experience many of them gained from playing a good percentage of the first round in 1st Grade; they came back with more confidence and belief in themselves.

It was as if the guys gave themself a test and said last year was simple, this year lets really challenge ourselves and do it the hard way. Lets put ourself in a position whereby we must win every game on the run home to qualify for the finals and see just how good we are. With each game their confidence grew as to did their belief in each other.

The run home was very special indeed and I purely put it down to the complete change in attitude from the player that reversed our form. To make the Grand Final from where we were shows just how good they can be if they put their minds to it and believe in themselves. Our frustration and disappointment with how they trained, played and performed early in the year turned to pride and complete and utter satisfaction by the end. Whilst the boys lost the Grand Final they took us on a magical ride and they should not worry about not getting another chance. Provided they put the effort in from the very beginning of the year and are committed to each other and the themselves, many of them will play in and win Grand Finals, many of them have the ability to do it in the highest grade too. More importantly it will be done at the Greatest Club in the World.

Special thanks to Tony Ray for all his tireless work behind the scenes and to Oliver Shaw for his dedication to the job, you will be sorely missed next year mate.



The Club is a non-reporting entity and the financial statements are a special purpose report prepared for use by the Members of the Club. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation's Act (NSW) 1994 and contain all the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standard AASB 1025 'Application of the Reporting Entity Concept and Other Amendments' with the exception of:

Consolidated Financial Statements; AASB 1028 Statement of Cashflows; and Statement of Accounting Concepts

because in the Committee's opinion to do so would have placed an unreasonable burden for a comparably minor benefit.

The financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis. They are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Significant accounting policies that have been involved in the preparation and presentation of these statements are:

Income Tax

The Association is exempt from Income Tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

b) Inventories

All inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realization value. Cost includes direct materials and are assigned to individual items of stock mainly on the basis of average cost.
