DDRFC - LIFE MEMBERS

1. H (Harry) GROSE * Appointed 1933

Captain Balmain DRFC 1911-13, Fullback and centre. Secretary Balmain DRFC 1914-1919. Instrumental, with Dr H Moran in merging the Glebe and Balmain Clubs in 1919. Appointed Life Member of NSWRU in 1940. President DDRFC 1940-1951. Patron 1953-1975.

2. E (Ted) MULLETT * Appointed 1933

Captain Balmain DRFC 1903-1908. Loose forward. First Rugby player in Australia to play 100 first grade games. President Drummoyne Juniors 1933-1950. Appointed Life Member of the NSWRU 1940. Patron DDRFC 1938-1951

3. SJ (Syd) GROSE * Appointed 1938

The earliest photo we have of Syd is in a match played by a Drummoyne touring team against Duntroon Military College in Canberra, dated 1922. The last is one taken with Syd, in full Vintage Reds gear, kicking off in the 1983 Golden Oldies aged 83. All those intervening years he was a committed Red. First grade player, first grade referee, selector, coach, NSWRU delegate. You name it, Syd did it.

4. CE MORGAN * Appointed 1939

First grade player mid 1920's. Went on to become an International referee. 4 Tests from 1932-1934. President of DDRFC 1929 - 1937. An outstanding administrator. Was Town Clerk of Drummoyne City Council for forty years.

5. Dr RL (Pup) RAYMOND (OBE) * Appointed 1957

Product of Fivedock Juniors, became an outstanding Waratah and Wallaby winger playing 13 Tests 1920 to 1923, scoring 10 tries. Rhodes scholar to Oxford 1924. Chosen to play for England, 3 Tests. Came back to play 55 first grade matches for the Club. Club Coach 1948-1951. Club President in 1952. Patron 1953-1963.

6. AJ (Arnold) TANCRED * Appointed 1957

Strong back rower in the Club's Premiership team of 1925, became a Waratah and Wallaby in 1927-1928. Highly respected in the administration of the NSWRU. Was the Manager of the very successful 1947- 1948 Wallabies to the UK, France and USA.

Largely responsible for the formation of the Licensed Club. Life Member of the NSWRU in 1950

7. E (Ted) CORAM Appointed 1957

The loss of an eye curtailed Ted's playing career, which began in several outstanding DDRFC junior premiership teams of the Thirties. Became the Hon Secretary during WW11, a difficult time when players, officials and referees were in short supply. For 10 years he was the Club delegate to the NSWRU, member of the important Schools' Committee of the NSWRU. Referee, and for many years the Club's touch judge. His other posts were Social Secretary and Selector. Maintains a strong interest in the Club and in the players, particularly the Drummoyne Juniors.

8. Dr L (Les) HIATT * Appointed 1961

The Club's long serving medical officer 1946-1959. Many of his stitches are still in place.

9. SG (Sep) LANGDON * Appointed 1972

Began his long career with the Club as the first grade team manager, then became our outstanding Secretary 1950 – 58. He was a highly popular Club President from 1963-67, always there with calm counsel and a personal interest in the well being of all players in every team. See later notes on the great partnership he formed with his wife Betty, now also a Life Member.

10. W G (Grahame) FIRTH Appointed 1978

Became involved with the Club for the very best of reasons his sons Bernard and David and son-in-law David Dyer were all keen players. A superb organizer, he was a splendid Club Secretary from 1961-1970 and then President 1971-2. He was a well respected member of the Committee of the Sydney Rugby Union.

11. VA ("Bunky") AULAND * Appointed 1978

One of Drummoyne's great players, member of the 1936 First Grade Premiership team of 1936, a rugged, uncompromising tight head breakaway, he was to chosen to play for NSW against the All Blacks and from all accounts, gave them plenty. Club President 1968-1970, then again 1973-1975. He was our Patron 1976 – 1994. His great loves were running the weekly raffle and organizing the car park.

12. A (Alan) CRAWFORD D.F.C.* Appointed 1986.

A player in the strong 1930's era, Alan was on outstanding RAAF bomber pilot during WW11, completing 55 bombing missions over Germany, mentioned in despatches 3 times for getting his burning plane home and being awarded the DFC. Returned home in 1945 to work hard for his old club over many years in many capacities as selector, Coach and Secretary in 1971, 1983 and 1984. Every Monday night for the seasons 1947-1985 he attended as our delegate the meetings of the NSWRU Grades Committee.

13. JG (John) MULFORD Appointed 1989

Captain of the Red's State junior undefeated Premiership teams of 1947-1978 and the Combined State U21 team, played in the First Grade team 1949-52 and then became a first grade referee. President of the Club 1982-87. Elected President of the Sydney Rugby Union in 1989 and Chairman and Senior Vice President of the NSWRU in 1990. Club Patron 2001 to present.

14. D (David) DYER * Appointed 1992

A fine player for Drummoyne Juniors and then in the senior grades, David extended his playing career after retirement in the Fifties by being available at call whenever a player went missing , no matter which team. He would then back up by running the line for first grade. What a clubman! With his financial expertise and wise counsel, he was an outstanding Club Treasurer from 1982 to 1991. Together with his wife Robin, now a Vice President of the Club, he kept the Club afloat through tough times.

15. M (Max) MILES * Appointed 1994

Fine first grade centre, Captain / Coach and lock forward in the Fifties, he was the backbone of the Club's on field efforts and was very unlucky not to have been selected for higher honours. He was the Club's Honorary Solicitor for many years and gave distinguished service in that role also to the NSWRU and the Australian Rugby Union. A true Rugby man.

16. AT (Arthur) TIERNEY * Appointed 1996

Our first grade hooker and front rower of the early forties, Arthur became one of Australia's most respected and loved characters. He refereed 140 first grade games and topped his career with the whistle by being appointed to referee the Test between Australia and the British Lions in 1959. Following his retirement, he became the Club's long serving timekeeper. He overcame a speech impediment with some classical oneliners which are still quoted by Wallabies and Reds around Australia.

17. R (Bob) DAY Appointed 2002

Long-time mate of Arthur Tierney, uncompromising eighty minute player from the forties and Assistant Commissioner of NSW Police, Bob dedicated many years to his old Club as Secretary, from 1989 to 1996, as a selector and delegate. He fought hard for the Club's return to First Division. A great swimmer in the World's Master Games, Bob encouraged the game of Rugby within the Police Force and tours both outbound and inbound around the world.

18. E (Betty) LANGDON Appointed 2002

Who could ever forget those 26 years Betty and her ladies ran just the best Rugby Kiosk in Sydney, initially with quite primitive facilities. Betty's cups of tea revived many a flagging player, as did her spirited words of encouragement. A great collaborator with husband Sep, as Secretary and then President, their home was the heart of Drummoyne Rugby for nearly 3 decades.

19. R (Roy) STEPHENSON Appointed 2002

A great Club stalwart, whose 3 sons, Barry, David and Michael have themselves given great service to the Club; he spent his young days growing up in Cometrowe Street, adjacent to the Oval. Always a strong debater on issues vital to the Club. Perhaps Roy's most notable contribution was the organizing of that superb Testimonial for the Club's great Australian Captain, Greg Davis, whose death at a relatively young age left a young family in need of support. Roy mobilized the support of the whole Australian Rugby

community and raised a large sum for a Foundation which provided for Greg's young family and educated the children.

20. F (Fred) ANDREWS Appointed 2004

Fred's playing days concluded in 1980. In 1982 he became involved in the Management Committee when John Mulford became President. In 1983 he took over Colts, coaching in what became known as the Golden Age of Drummoyne Colts. Fred moved up to the senior grades in 1987 and took over 1st Grade in 1989. His team won ten of their last 11 matches including a memorable victory over Minor Premiers, Norths. Fred then formed a close coaching alliance with former First Grade and Club Captain Peter McSullea, which took the club into the nineties and eventually back into First Division.

In more recent years, Fred has been the cornerstone of the re-birth of the club in the NSWSRU as both as a Grade Coach and Club Coach.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

YEAR 2006 – Season 132

I ended last season's report by saying "In conclusion, close season activity and planning is well advanced for season 132 and I firmly believe that we can look forward with confidence, but not complacency, to being the club to beat again in 2006"

In the case of First Grade it was evident from day one that we had assembled a team to be reckoned with and they made this their season losing only once and winning the Grand Final in great (or "grand") style.

The other highlight of the season for me was the 4th grade win over St Pats to secure a place in the finals. They overcame 20 minute of dubious "sin binning", soaked up all that St Pats could throw at them and stuck at it to score the winning try very much on the final play of the match. It's hard to recall any time that I have seen such a display of determination and character. Andy Farley's leadership and commitment represented all that is typical of Drummoyne Rugby and at age 40 we all think he is too young to retire, but respect his decision to do so and look forward to having him back next year coaching

Coaching again was led by Fred Andrews as Club Coaching Coordinator or Head Coach. For First Grade we welcomed back David (Bearshead) Newall to partner with David Warne, supported as always by Frank "JJ" Tait and the results speak for themselves. The combination of coaching maturity and player talent made Saturday a day of immense anticipation week in week out. I've said it before that the challenge in writing this report is to leave one or two superlatives behind so that I can use them next season! Tough after this one, with so much talent and so many great displays and yet the best was kept until the last! They will be a hard act to follow.

Second Grade was coached by Peter Gavrilis and Nathan Wicks supported by Tony Ray and Gareth Kelly had a very strong first half of the season, helping us ride at the top of the championship table well past the halfway mark. Then sadly we began to run out of depth in spite of very positive numbers at the beginning of the year. We registered over 200 names yet at the end of the year were struggling to get 70 individuals on the paddock week by week!

Geoff Granger with assistance from Monty Mali took on the perennial challenge of fielding a third grade side as in the majority of our seasons, the task proved insurmountable and in spite of a few early results, the season was very unrewarding. However our thanks to Geoff for sticking at it, to Tom Hill for helping out and for those club stalwarts who provided the hard core that ran on week by week. We do have some initiatives under way to see if we can do a better job of player retention next year.

Fourth grade as already mentioned excelled themselves, overcoming a minor slump in mid season to reach the Grand Final the hard way by finishing fourth in the minor premiership. Andy Farley as Captain and Coach was partnered by Sepe Tupolea in his first season as a coach. As always, it's good to see former players putting something back into the game and Sepe has had a long playing history with Drummoyne. There is also a strong rumour that his son will debut with us next year.

Fifth Grade just went out and did it again. For the second year running they went down to their nemesis, Iggies in the Grand Final after proving their worth throughout the season as runners up in the Minor Premiership. They have already indicated a commitment to make it third time lucky! Thanks to Andrew Shipman for coaching and Sam Moussa for managing.

Colts, again in spite of some very one-sided results and shortage of numbers, never gave up. We still have not found the solution to offset our lack of a natural feeder school or system. However there is an opportunity with the reduction in the number of junior sides to be fielded at grade level next year for us to benefit and there are number of initiatives under way to make sure that we do. The side was coached in the main by Wayne Shields, with help from a variety of other club stalwarts.

Ladies had another mixed season, with numbers becoming an issue. Again efforts are underway to redress this for 2007. Thanks to Marc Ashworth for coaching and special mention to Liz Corbett for her efforts to

hold things together through a very tough season.

Juniors as always continue in strength of numbers and good standards under the continued leadership of Michaels, Stephenson and Hahn. The only issue from a senior point of view is that they are not getting old enough quick enough to give us a core of under 21's! The under 12's won their Grand Final and I have been assured that the two coaches intend to stay the course and take their boys up to the under 21 level!

Vice Presidents' and Veteran's Day, was again well supported, including a visit from our local MP, John Murphy and VIP for the day, former Club President, Graham Firth who allowed us the honour of sharing in celebrating his 100th birthday. Many thanks to John Mulford, Robin Dyer and the Firth family for making Drummoyne oval the venue for such a momentous even. Unfortunately the only real highlight was the win by the Vintage Reds over the Mosman Whalers, with 1st grade choosing the day to record their only loss of the season.

Off the field we again found willing hands to ensure that we had a wide variety of opportunities to bond and show off our social talents. Colin Baggott was again visible and had a guiding hand in ensuring that our social calendar was properly addressed. Thanks also to Mark Liversidge (including his end of season "tour") and Nathan Landry for their time, energy and creativity, much appreciated. It's no good having fun on the field if you can't do the same off the field and I think we did both extremely well this year. Thanks to all.

Financially, as you will see from the Treasurer's report, we had a reasonable year, finishing slightly better off than we started. Again I must acknowledge the sterling contribution of Geoff Granger in managing the club purse. He also warrants recognition for initiating the "Friends of Drummoyne Rugby Club", with help from Scott Carrodus and friends. Their objective is to take a longer term financial view and establish a trust fund that will be positioned to address future extraordinary financial challenges to the survival of the club that will almost certainly arise from time to time..

Thanks again also to John Mulford our Club Patron for his continued support and wise counsel; the support of all of the Management Committee, driven this year by the next in a long line of great club secretaries, Scott Carrodus; Daniel Cook in his first season as Club Captain; Sandy Bannatyne, Home Ground Steward again and his fantastic group of helpers in the Canteen(s) namely, Elma, Sheila, Toni, Lee, Jane, with Ronnie and Tony ("Beep-Beep") on the BBQ. We continue to be congratulated by the clubs that matter on the quality of our home ground environment and our canteen services. (Not to forget the continued speciality of the Warnie Burger, which no other club can begin to match)

Our web site is managed for us by Hamish Beattie and the wealth of photographs are thanks to Tom Hill.

Thanks also go to Dr David Todd, Physio (and star of 1st Grade) Tim Cruikshank and his assistant physio, Stacey Cubitt, Shane Kelly for strapping, and Anthony (Swanno) Swanson and his Scoring box team.

As always, I acknowledge and appreciate the support and contribution of my wife Elma and her passion for the club and the game.

In conclusion, it was another memorable season and we move out of it well positioned to take on season 133 and continue to be the club to beat again in 2007.

"Dominant Drummoyne Lifts the Kentwell Cup"

Drummoyne has taken out the 2006 Kentwell Cup, outgunning a valiant Knox Old Boys 30 points to 15 in the NSW Suburban Rugby Division One first grade Grand Final at TG Millner Field.

The match began at a frantic pace, with Dirty Reds flyhalf Boden Mackey laying on the first try of the match with a judicious kick for winger Adriano Biancotto who scored in the corner.

Mackey missed the conversion, however a successful shot at penalty soon after had Drummoyne leading eight points to nil.

The Reds number ten was again in the thick of the action at the midpoint of the half, snaring a midfield intercept before putting John Wantepe over for his side's second try.

The Drummoyne forwards then turned on the heat, with some intelligent pick and drive play seeing no.8 Scott Monaghan set up Wantepe for his second and a 20-nil lead on the cusp of half time.

Knox worked their way back into contention before the break through an unconverted try to winger Jeremy Farrell, the score sitting at 20 points to 5 in favour of the Reds at half time.

Drummoyne began the second half in much the same fashion as the first, with some scintillating backline play resulting in two quick tries scored by Monaghan and Matthew Hillyard.

With the match seemingly in the bag at 30 points to 5, Drummoyne allowed Knox back into the hunt with strong forward rushes laying on tries to Jefferson Granger and Tim Cussell.

However the class and depth of the Reds wouldn't be denied, Monaghan taking out the Golden Boots trophy for man of the match in his side's 30 to 15 victory.

The win is Drummoyne's fourth Kentwell Cup success, adding to their victories in 2004, 2000 and 1947.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose report prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Associations Incorporation Act NSW 1984.

The report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW 1984 and the following Australian Accounting Standards and Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views:

AAS 1: Statement of Financial Performance AAS 5: Materiality AAS 8: Events Occurring after Reporting Date AAS 36: Statement of Financial Position AAS 37: Financial Report Presentation and Disclosure, and AASB 1028: Statement of Cashflows

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Income Tax

Scope
